

WHEREAS

the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally reconized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe reconized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS

the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS

the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS

the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Storzer Property, W1775 Pearl St., Seymour, WI. Tax Parcel #17-0-0055-01

WHEREAS.

the parcel is described as follows:

A PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN PART OF GOVERNMENT LOTS TWO (2) THREE (3) OF SECTION 35-FIVE (35), TOWNSHIP TWENTY-FOUR AND NORTH, RANGE EIGHTEEN (18)EAST, FOURTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, TOWN OF ONEIDA, OUTAGAMIE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, MORE FULLY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: COMMENCING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 35; THENCE S80-00-00W, 835.29 FEET ALONG THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 35 TO THE EAST LINE OF GOVERNMENT LOT TWO (2) AND THE POINT OF BEGINNING; THENCE S00-05-33W, 406.29 FEET (RECORDED AS 400.00 FEET) ALONG SAID EAST LINE TO THE NORTH LINE OF LOT 1 OF CERTIFIED SURVEY MAP NUMBER 1305 AS RECORDED IN VOLUME 7 OF CERTIFIED SURVEY MAPS ON PAGE 1305; THENCE S80-00-00W, 529.73 FEET (RECORDED AS 555.00 FEET) ALONG SAID NORTH LINE TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF LANDS DESCRIBED IN JACKET 11088, IMAGE 50; THENCE N10-00-00W, 400.00 FEET ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SAID DESCRIBED LANDS TO THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 35; THENCE N80-00-00E, 600.93 FEET (RECORDED AS 555.00 FEET) ALONG SAID NORTH LINE TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. RESERVING THAT PART PRESENTLY USED FOR ROAD PURPOSES.

the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
