## RESOLUTION # 1-18-85-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council to protect and preserve the sovereignty of the Oneida Tribe, its rights and its resources, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has taken steps to protect the health of Oneida people through the establishment of the Oneida Health Center and the Oneida Environmental Health Department, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and the Oneida Health Center in conjunction with the Oneida Environmental Health Department intends to insure the protection and best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the Oneida people, and
- WHEREAS, the local inspection of food dispensed within the Oneida reservation boundaries would implement the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the Oneida People and the public.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee, on behalf of the Oneida General Tribal Council, adopts the Oneida Food Dispensary Ordinance.
