RESOLUTION # 1-18-95 F

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is dedicated to preserving and protecting tribal land and the environment as stated in the Seventh Generation Commitment, and

WHEREAS, Eighty (80%) of the landfills in the United States will be filled to capacity in 1995, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe, through the Department of Economic Development is dedicated to establishing diverse businesses which will provide alternative income sources to maximize tribal investments, and


WHEREAS, Starflex is an additive that is mixed with Low Density Polyethylene (LDPE) to produce road pavement and has been used successfully in Europe since 1990, and

WHEREAS, the Starflex additive could permit the recycling of up to 2 million tons of plastics while improving the quality of road pavement.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin make application to the Department of Natural Resources for a Wisconsin Waste Reduction and Recycling Demonstration Grant.
