RESOLUTION 1-21-80 A

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. is in the process of updating the Tribal financial office and,

WHEREAS, There is a need for T/TA beyond the Tribal resources to accomplish certain needs in the updating and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe does not presently have the financial capabilities to meet these costs and,

WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has tentatively approved a request in the amount of \$1,950.00 to help meet these needs contingent on a resolution,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. do hereby request the Bureau of Indian Affairs transfer over to the Oneida Tribe the said amount of \$1,950.00 to be used for said purpose to meet the financial costs of a needs assessment which includes, hardware and software assessment, indirect cost assistance and on site computer review of operation by the Oneida Accounting staff.
