- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nations Arts Program and with the collaboration and support of the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation would like to preserve protect, and share the cultural heritage of the Oneida people for the next seven generations, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin-Oneida Nation Arts Program, authorizes and submits this grant application to the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation for the Oneida Teen Theater Project.
