RESOLUTION 2-6-79-B

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin administers a program for Indians called the Relief to Needy Indian Persons Program (RNIP), and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. has a contract to conduct such Program for the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has taken steps to expand social services programs to members and other Indian persons,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe will contract, as soon as it practicable, with the State of Wisconsin for Income Maintenance Programs for all Indian people in Brown and Outagamie Counties.
