- WHEREAS, It is imperative at this time that Indian Tribes show Tribal solidarity; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe is the host Tribe for this Annual Conference in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED


That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin endorse the Annual Conference in Green Bay, Wisconsin, on October 9 - 14, 1983,
