RESOLUTION 2-8-80

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. has approved the FY 1980 P.L. 93-638 budget and,

WHEREAS, The P.L. 93-638 budget reflects ways in meeting the Oneida Tribal needs in a total accounting office and management plan and,

WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has been notified of the approved budget by the Oneida Business Committee and also has been advised regarding the stages of planning and implementation and,

WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs Agency officials did basically agree on the need and approach being taken by the Oneida Tribe to resolve the problems that exist within the present system.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. do hereby further approve by resolution the P.L. 93-638 budget and direct the B.I.A. to expedite finalization of said contract in order to meet the financial obligations and time schedule of said contract.
