RESOLUTION 72-10

WHEREAS AS THERE is a substantial number of sub-standard homes on the Oneida Reservation,

WHEREAS THE H.I.P. Housing Program of Bureau of Indian Affairs is one of the better programs to be implemented in recent years,

WHEREAS THE FUNDS appropriated for H.I.P. housing falls far short of the need,

WHEREAS THE ALLOCATION for 1972 is for four (4) homes to be renovated and nine (9) homes for renovation in 1973;

WHEREAS AS THIS rate of progress will not meet the dire need of the older Tribal members;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin apply to the Luthern Council, U.S.A. for funds to supplement the H.I.P. housing programs.
