Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States, was made possible.




## RESOLUTION # 2-13-87-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized tribe with a history of meeting the needs of its people through the process of contracting of services under the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has successfully operated an elementary school for the Indian youth of this community for the past seven years, and
- WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the Oneida Tribe to continue the process of education for its constituency, and
- WHEREAS, it is the considered decision of the Oneida Business Committee, not the expansion of the Oneida Education System, to include a highschool, grade 9 through 12, which will materially advance the interests of the Oneida Tribe in the education of its young people.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians hereby formally requests authorization for an expansion of the existing Kindergarten through eight grade program to include grades nine through twelve.
