Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States, was made possible.


RESOLUTION # 1-15-95-C

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to continue to acquire, preserve, protect, and improve the tribal lands and environment, and respond to the needs of our Mother Earth through integrated management, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Environmental Department believes that we must respect, honor and care for Mother Earth and her families within the sacred circle of life, nurturing all generations, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe recognizes the importance of regulating environmental quality pursuant to Federal and Tribal Environmental Laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin-Oneida Environmental Department authorizes and submits this grant application to the United States Department of Health and Human Services for the purpose of developing and enhancing the Oneida Tribal Environmental infrastructure required to support a Tribal environmental regulatory program.
