RESOLUTION # 2-15-95-I

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Oneida Business Committee Resolution No. 1-18-95 G approved the use of the language "Oneida Reservation" on Wisconsin Department of Transportation signs at entrances to the Oneida Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Planning Department has indicated that the State of Wisconsin would be amenable to signs reading "Oneida Nation Reservation",

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee does hereby approve the terms "Oneida Nation Reservation" for Wisconsin Department of Transportation signs to be erected at the boundaries of the Oneida Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall supersede Resolution 1-18-95 G.
