RESOLUTION # 02-17-99A Wisconsin Arts Board Resolution

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treat tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seven Generation Commitment "to build a solid educational foundation by addressing human needs of all its members throughout the circle of life", and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Nation Arts Program to provide the highest quality educational and support services to all children and families and to empower the children through the use of developmental practices which reflect the unique cultural heritage of the Oneida people, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation Arts Program with the collaboration of the Wisconsin Arts Board, would like to preserve and protect the cultural heritage of the Oneida people for the next seven generations, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin in collaboration with the Wisconsin Arts Board authorizes and submits grant applications for the Performing Arts Network to bring in performing artists in the Oneida Concert Series, Community Development Project to develop an on-line artist registry and web site and the Regranting Program to continue to offer regranting dollars to the Oneida community.
