RESOLUTION NO.
2-20-78-B

- WHEREAS, the ONEIDA TRIBE OF INDIANS is eligible to apply for contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to plan, conduct, and administer all or parts of Bureau authorized programs, under authority of Public Law 93-638, and
- WHEREAS, the ONEIDA TRIBE OF INDIANS has determined to contract the Bureau's Agricultural extension program for FY 78 under PL 93-638,
- WHEREAS, the ONEIDA TRIBE OF INDIANS has contracted with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the administration of Agricultural program in past years and
- WHEREAS, the ONEIDA TRIBE OF INDIANS has used these agricultural program funds as an integral part of its agricultural production and training project and
- WHEREAS, the ONEIDA TRIBE OF INDIANS is again implementing an expanded agricultural production and training project and
- WHEREAS, the funds received from this BIA grant are the only funds which the Oneida Tribe has had available for the purchase of seed, fertilizer, and plowing services, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. The scope of the contract is to plan, conduct, and administer the Tribal Agricultural Education and/or Increased Extension Program as desired by the Tribe covering services and supplies for establishing agricultural classes of instruction or demonstration projects such as vegetable and flower gardens, landscaping, food preservation, cooking, and home economics, and the establishment or enhancement of 4-H or other agricultural orientated youth groups and their related agricultural projects.
2. The Tribal Chairman/Chairperson (or his/her designee) can contract any amendments thereto.
3. The authorities granted herein shall be effective through September 30, 1978 for the tribal government for review to contract and any amendments thereto before and after execution of the contract.
4. Proposal starting date for the contract is April 1, 1978.
5. The Oneida Tribe hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs put forth all possible effort and explore all possible funding channels to ensure that Agricultural production funds are once again made available to Indian Tribes who have properly used these funds and are again in need of these funds to carry out their agricultural programs.

RESOLUTION NO. 2-20-78-B

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR PRELIMINARY LOAN
FOR LOW-RENT PUBLIC HOUSING

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the United States of America, acting through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Government"), is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-rent housing projects that will assist in meeting this goal; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise and that the Government shall not make any contract with a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low-rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Housing Authority ^{1/} (herein called the "Local Authority") is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for a preliminary loan to cover the costs of surveys and planning in connection with the development of low-rent housing;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Oneida Business Committee ^{2/}
of the ~~Reservat~~ Reservat ^{3/} of Oneida ^{4/} as follows:

1. That there exists in the Reservat ^{3/} of Oneida ^{4/} a need for such low-rent housing which is not being met by private enterprise;

2. That the application of the Local Authority to the Government for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed \$52,500 for surveys and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects of not to exceed approximately

Thirty five (35) dwelling units is hereby approved.
