## RESOLUTION # 2-23-88-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Housing Authority was created under Tribal Ordinance dated 04-20-63 to provide decent, safe and sanitary housing needs for low-income people living in the community, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee wishes to accommodate the future growth of the Oneida Housing Authority, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee wishes to distribute the policy making and decisions of the Oneida Housing Authority through its Tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee wishes to promote more participation of tribal members by serving on the Oneida Housing Authority Board.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee wishes the By-Laws be amended to allow for an increase to a SEVEN member board in order to better serve the needs of the community as a whole and support the continued growth of the Oneida Housing Authority for a more economical and efficient housing operation.
