RESOLUTION # 03-05-97A


Oneida Water Quality Monitoring and Management Plan Grant Application

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has assumed responsibility for preserving and protecting the waters of the Oneida Reservation for future generations, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Environmental Department to "effectively promote a respect for our environment using our abilities to plan, educate and regulate with the cooperation of the Oneida community", and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has EPA approved Water Quality Standards and Treatment as a State for Section 303 and 401 of the Clean Water Act, and
- WHEREAS, the reservation community consisting of Oneida Indians, other Native Americans and Non-Indians; has been actively involved in defining the needs of the community and tribal environmental program direction since February of 1995, by participating in Environmental Resource Board community meetings, responding to surveys and ranking their environmental concerns by number of importance in questionnaires, and
- WHEREAS, the reservation community will have consistent access to information and project progress through the Environmental Resource Board community meetings and articles published in the tribal newspaper.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits this application to the Administration for Native Americans for an Environmental Regulatory Enhancement grant to develop and implement an Oneida Water Quality Monitoring and Management Plan and to research and develop regulations consistent with Section 402 and 404 of the Clean Water Act.
