RESOLUTION 3-24-82-F

- WHEREAS: The Indian Self-Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract for Bureau Programs, and,
- WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and,
- WHEREAS: The Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their endeavors,
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, request a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs unbanded allocations to conduct a Water Resources Management Program and that the Tribal Administrator is authorized to negotiate the contract and any amends there to,
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That this resolution expire on September 30, 1984, and that The Business Committee be allowed to review any and all modification prior to execution and,
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the proposed date will be August 1, 1982, and remain in effect for a period of one-year.
