Bureau of Indian Affairs Master Contract
Resolution No: 3-24-82-G

- Whereas, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is responsible for providing and/or facilitating educational opportunities for it's tribal members, and,
- Whereas, It is the intent of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to optimally administer and manage all programs directly effecting it's membership, and,
- Whereas, Public Law 93-638 stipulates that Indian Tribes "are entitled to contract with the Bureau to plan, conduct, and administer all or parts of any program which the Bureau is authorized to administer. . . " and,
- Whereas, The Self-Determination policy becomes manifest with self-direction and implementation,

Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin request to contract and administer the following BIA unbanded programs for Fiscal Year 1982-83 utilizing the Master Contract concept:

Energy Education/Planning Project

- Be It Further Resolved, that FY'82 contract negotiations, amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Oneida Education Director and Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.
- Be It Further Resolved, that all allocations pertaining to this contract be made available May 1, 1982 via Letter of Credit and that proposed term of the contract commence on May 1, 1982 and complete April 30, 1983.
