Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.


## RESOLUTION # 4-10-96-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, a priority of the Seventh Generation Commitment is to protect the land and preserve the environment, and
- WHEREAS, limited funds are available to clear up petroleum contaminated sites to high standards, and
- WHEREAS, available technology for petroleum clean up is not effective under certain conditions, and
- WHEREAS, a Risk Based Corrective Action study could identify if any health risks exist from petroleum contamination at the Hwy. 54 One Stop and dismiss the need for further corrective action.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Oneida Tribe authorizes and submits this application to the the Environmental Protection Agency for a Leaking Underground Storage Tanks (LUST) grant.
