Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States, was made possible.


## BUSINESS COMMITTEE RESOLUTION NO. 4-13-94-C

### 1994 Priority List Roads

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, eligibility for funding under ISTEA requires the submission of a "Priority List" of transportation projects to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and
- WHEREAS, the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) of 1991, Public Law 102-240, has provided funding to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the purpose of Transportation Planning on the Indian Reservations, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians has the expertise required to successfully administer the required transportation planning on the Oneida Reservation
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee hereby adopts the attached 1994 "Priority List" as required by the Bureau of Indian Affairs for purposes of transportation construction funding.
