RESOLUTION NO. 4-22-92-C

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribal Council has delegated to the Business Committee authority to exercise the enumerated powers of the Oneida Constitution, Article IV as amended, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:

All of Government Lot Twenty-two (22); All of Government Lot Twenty-five (25) less and excepting premises conveyed for highway purposes; the Southwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 less and excepting the Southerly 989 feet thereof and less premises conveyed for highway purposes; and the Southeast 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 less and excepting the Southerly 500 feet thereof; all in Section Eleven (11), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Eighteen (18) East, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.


WHEREAS, The above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base, which is adjacent to existing trust land and increase land for conservation and/or agricultural, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
