RESOLUTION NO. 9-24-96-D

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, **Clement and Mary Metoxen, both tribal members are holder of said LAND ASSIGNMENT more particularly described as follows:**

East 6 acres of the North ½ Northeast 1/4 Southeast 1/4, Section 11, Township 23 North, Range 18 East, located in Outagamie County.

As of Oct. 16, 1969 - verification that site had been reduced to 2 ½ acres of land remaining and as of October 24, 1991, required an easement to install mound system on site.


WHEREAS, **Clement and Mary Metoxen holders of said leaseholders no longer wish to use said lease site.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Committee in Regular session assembled, hereby approve the above modification of lease, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairwoman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease **CANCELLATION** documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
