UGWA DEMOLUM YATEHE Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Division of Land Management is a Federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Division of Land Management, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Clifford Cornelius, #0795 and Leanne M. (Skenandore) Doxtater, #5164, a/are Tribal Member(s), have made application for a long-term lease for residential purposes; and

WHEREAS, Clifford Cornelius, #0795 and Leanne M. (Skenandore) Doxtater, #5164, has/have been designated Lease No. RL 2863(97) for the Tribal land selected and is more particularly described as follows: N6778 Seminary Road, Oneida WI 54155.

A parcel of land located in Private Claim 107, T23N, R19E, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, which is more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the Northwest Corner of Private Claim 105 of said Township; Thence N38degrees 14'31"E, 33.00 feet along the centerline of Seminary Road to the point of beginning; Thence continuing N38degrees 14'31"W, 241.70 feet; Thence N52degrees 26'52"W, 360.48 feet to the point of beginning.

Said parcel contains 2.00 acres of land more or less (1.81 less road) and is subject to all easements and restrictions of record reserving that part presently being used for road purposes.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin's Division of Land Management is responsible for managing all tribal real property assets, including leases, through rules and policies approved in Oneida Real Property Law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Committee in <u>Keguian</u>, assembled, hereby requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to draft a lease in accordance with the Act of August 9, 1955 (69 Stat, 539), as amended, 25 USC 415, for the above-described land with a 25 year term which shall automatically and without notice renew for an additional term of 25 years at a total rental, \$1.00 per year or \$50 for fifty years, at a total rental to be determined by an appraisal, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Christine M. Doxtator, Land Management Director, or her designee, be authorized to execute said lease agreement on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.
