RESOLUTION # 5-24-95 E

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Patricia Madrid, a tribal member holder of lease no. RL-2639(95) described as follows:

Lot 7, Standing Stone Subdivision, a part of Indian Claim 151 & 147, Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, containing .37 acres, more or less, subject to all valid existing right-of-way of record.

WHEREAS, Patricia Madrid, a tribal member holder of lease no. RL-2639(95) wishes to modify her lease as follows:


DELETE: Patricia Madrid, a tribal member

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee in Regular Session assembled, hereby approves the *Modification of lease no. RL-2639(95)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease *Modification documents for and in behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
