WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc., has a full improved Industrial Park, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribal Council has recognized economic development as a high-priority objective to improve the economic condition of the reservation, and

WHEREAS, the present Industrial Development Program is in the process of a promotional campaign,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee is requesting financial assistance in the amount of \$5,000 from the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Minneapolis Area Office, to assist the Tribe in our industrial development efforts to locate job-generating industry for the tribally-owned park.
