RESOLUTION NO. 6-7-83-A

- WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States has recently passed legislation to provide for emergency expenditures to meet national needs; and,
- WHEREAS, This legislation is commonly referred to as the Jobs Bill; and,
- WHEREAS, One provision of the Jobs Bill provides for a supplemental allocation of \$30 million to the BIA HIP Housing Program; and,
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has been charged with the responsibility of distributing this \$30 million HIP appropriation equitably among the nation's Indian Tribes; and,
- WHEREAS, Equitable distribution formulas can be achieved only through a structured process which provides for full participation and maximum input from the affected Tribes; and,
- WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs has made no such consultations that the Oneida Tribe is aware of; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee, at its own initiative, has made efforts to update the BIA regarding its need for supplemental HIP Housing Funds, specifically, those appropriated through the Jobs Bill; and,
- WHEREAS, These funds are needed to alleviate severe housing problems; and,
- WHEREAS, Notwithstanding any of the above, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has developed a distribution formula for the Jobs Bill's supplemental \$30 million in HIP funding; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee feels very strongly that the proposed distribution formula is NOT equitable; so,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

That the Oneida Tribe does hereby call for an immediate investigation on the procedures and formula used to allocate these funds, and that the Oneida Tribe does hereby demand that the pending distribution of these HIP funds be suspended; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,

That an equitable and structured process which allows for maximum input from affected Indian Tribes should be developed and implemented immediately in order to effect a timely and just reallocation of these funds.
