
RESOLUTION #06-08-94-C

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has adopted a nation mission, vision, and priorities to guide our stability and growth as a nation, and
- WHEREAS, one of our national priorities is to continue to acquire, preserve, protect, and improve the tribal land and environment, and we respond to the needs of our Mother Earth through integrated management, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation, through the Environmental Resource Board has committed to co-sponsoring the 5th Annual Protect Mother Earth Conference, and
- WHEREAS, it is desired that all Oneida people be encouraged to attend and participate in this event, and
- WHEREAS, Oneida people who are employed by the Tribe who wish to participate are urged to make arrangements in advance with their supervisors to attend using all applicable provisions of the Oneida Personnel Policies and Procedures,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, all employees of the Oneida Tribe are hereby authorized to attend the 5th Annual Protect Mother Earth Conference, June 15 - 19, 1994, by arranging with their supervisors so their work and responsibilities will not be interrupted under the applicable provisions of the Oneida Personnel Policies and Procedures.
