RESOLUTION # 06-23-93-I

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, to manage all the economic affairs and enterprises of the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Bell, Inc. requested a Right-of-Way Grant to place, replace, maintain and remove buried cables and associated appliances on, over and beneath lands held in trust by the United States of America on behalf of the Oneida Tribe located in Township 23 North, Range 19 East, Section 7 in the Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin more properly described as: The south one rod of that part of GOVERNMENT LOT 21 lying immediately adjacent to, parallel with and north of the north right-of-way line of Ranch Road, Parcel No. 17-0-1469; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe desires and requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs Superintendent of the Great Lakes Agency to grant formal application for right-of-way to Wisconsin Bell, Inc. to the above mentioned property.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin designates any two of its four officers to act in its stead as signatories to the Right-of-Way Grant for the property located as above described in the Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs grant the formal application for right-of-way to Wisconsin Bell, Inc; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe reserves its right to impose user fees on this utility should it be prudent to do so.
