Resolution:

Whereas, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government, a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and a Self-Governance Tribe with the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs and with the Department of Health and Human Services's Indian Health Service; and

Whereas, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

Whereas, The Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and

Whereas, it is the mission of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin to protect and improve the resources, the standards of living, and the environment in which the Oneida people live while maintaining, enforcing, and exercising the sovereign rights of the Oneida Nation; and

Whereas, the Oneida Business Committee has determined that entering into a Self-Governance Compact and Annual Funding Agreement with the U.S. Government's Department of Health and Human Service's Indian Health Service pursuant to P.L. 93-638, as amended, supports and enhances the Oneida Nation's sovereignty.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin approves the Annual Funding Agreement negotiated with the Department of Health and Human Services Indian Health Service for Fiscal Year 2000 and authorizes the Vice-Chairman to sign the Annual Funding Agreement as negotiated.
