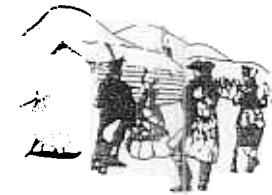

RESOLUTION # 7-23-99-B Smith Farm Development Project

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and
- WHEREAS, Congress by enactment of the Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century (TEA 21) provided a mechanism for Indian Tribes to exercise the right of SELF-DETERMINATION, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation tribal roads must be placed on the Bureau of Indian Affairs Reservation Roads System Inventory to qualify for Maintenance and Construction Dollars, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation Department of Public Works is responsible for providing maintenance service to Tribal roads, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation is requesting a contract modification for contract number CTF55T43333 Smit Farm development

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Nation will place the Smit Farm development project on the Transportation Improvement Plan as a secondary priority.
