RESOLUTION NO. 8-10-82-A

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Tribe governed by its own constitution and by-laws; and,
- WHEREAS, Said Tribe is jointly active in promoting the health, safety and well being of its members as well as the membership of all other Wisconsin Tribes; and,
- WHEREAS, Said Tribe is pledged to cooperate with all local governments in areas of common concern; and,
- WHEREAS, Wisconsin has been designated as a potential radioactive waste dump area; and,
- WHEREAS, The State's of Michigan and Minnesota, being in the same designated area for radioactive waste storage, have indicated they will not be considered as a dump area without approval of their residents, and the State of Wisconsin has yet to take that stance; and,
- WHEREAS, The technology has yet to be proven regarding the safe storage of radioactive waste in Wisconsin; and,
- WHEREAS, The storage of nuclear waste will pose a significant threat to the economy, environment, health, safety and welfare of Wisconsin residents; and,
- WHEREAS, The effects of nuclear waste storage will not be limited to the specific chosen sites; and,
- WHEREAS, It is the duty of this Tribe to protect and promote the interests, health, safety and welfare of its members and community;
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin does hereby promote a moratorium on the storage of radioactive materials in a nuclear waste dump in Wisconsin until such time as all residents of Wisconsin, especially those residents in any area of a chosen dump

site, are satisfied as demonstrated in public forum that their interests, health, safety and welfare are protected and promoted by such a proposed radioactive or nuclear waste dump.
