Request for BIA to Begin Trust Acquisition Process

WHEREAS, The Oneida General Tribal Council has delegated to the Oneida Business Committee authority to exercise the enumerated powers of the Oneida Constitution, Article IV, as amended, and

WHEREAS, Article IV (f) of the Oneida Constitution authorizes the appropriation of available Tribal funds for public purposes, and

WHEREAS, funds are presently available for the purchase of the following parcel of land:

Beginning in the S.W. corner of the N.W. 1/4 of Section 3, Township 22, Range 19 East, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, thence North 490 feet to point of beginning, thence North 330 feet, thence East 330 feet thence South 330, thence West to P.O.B. containing 2.5 acres more or less. and

WHEREAS, the above property is now held in fee simple status

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process necessary to acquire the above parcel in Trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians.
