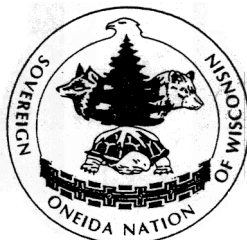

RESOLUTION # 8-23-95-P

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Fischer property behind Rendezvous. Tax Parcel No.: 6H-1178-4

WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Part of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 30, T 24 N, R 20 E, City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the Southeast corner of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30, T 24 N, R 20 E; thence S 87°59'35" W, 492.11 feet; thence N 01°31'55" West, 550.01 feet to the point of beginning also being the Northeast corner of Volume 7, Certified Survey Maps Page 123, Brown County Records; thence S 87°59'43" W, 170.00 feet along the North Line of Volume 7, Certified Survey Maps Page 123, Brown County Records to the Northwest corner of said Certified Survey Map; thence S 01°31'55" E, 195.00 feet along the West line of said Certified Survey Map to the centerline of a future 70 foot street; thence S 87°59'43" W, 158.00 feet along the centerline of said future street; thence N 01°31'11" W 969.27 feet to the North line of the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 30 also being the centerline of a future east-west 70 foot street; thence N 87°37'01" E, 327.84 feet along the said North line and said centerline to the Northwest Corner of Certified Survey Map, Volume 7, Page 135, Brown County Records being the centerline of a future North-South 70 foot street; thence S 01°31'55" E, 776.42 feet along the West line of Volume 7, Certified Survey Maps, Page 135, Brown County Records and said North-South centerline to the point of beginning. Parcel contains 6.54 acres more or less, Excepting therefrom any land previously dedicated for road purposes.

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and


