

I would also like to remind you that the pardon you have received pertains to those past offenses which existed at the time you *applied* for the pardon. Please remember that any violation which occurs <u>after</u> this date may again effect your eligibility to remain employed within the Oneida Tribe. If you happen to violate any law which would make you ineligible for employment or continued employment, then you will no longer be permitted to work within the Oneida Tribe's operation (per Tribal policy and procedures).

In closing, I again say CONGRATULATIONS on your pardon and wish you the best in your future endeavors.
