I regret to inform you that your application for a pardon has been denied based on the recent dates that the crime/crimes were committed.

According to the Oneida Tribe's Pardon Procedures Policy, S4-6.b., "The decision of the Oneida Business Committee shall be final for a period of one (1) year in the event the application is denied." Therefore, you may reapply for a pardon one year from this date. I would strongly encourage you to submit an application to the Oneida Pardon Office for consideration at that time.
