
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

UGWA DEMOLUM YATEHE Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Environmental Department to "effectively promote a respect for our environment using our abilities to plan, educated, and regulate with the cooperation of the Oneida Community", and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby requests financial assistance under. 159.23, <u>Wis. Stats.</u>, Chapter NR 542. <u>Wis. Admin. Code</u>, for the purpose of planning, constructing or operating a recycling program with one or more components specified in s. 159.11(2)(a) to (h), <u>Wis. Stats.</u>,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin HEREBY AUTHORIZES Inez Skenandore, an employee of the responsible unit, and/or Deborah Doxtator an elected official of the responsible unit, to act on its behalf to submit an application to the Department of Natural Resources for financial assistance under 159.23, Wis. Stats., Chapter NR 542. Wis. Admin. Code; sign necessary documents; and submit a final report.
