RESOLUTION # 9-06-00-D
Section 404(g) State Lead Grant
U.S. Environmental Protection Agency

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined that the overall goal is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Environmental Industrial Health Program is charged with the responsibility of protecting the community and employee's health and to preserve resources through education and technical assistance by promoting safe waste management, industrial hygiene and sanitation practices, and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Industrial Health Program was delegated the responsibility to administer a Lead Program for regulatory compliance in all tribal properties, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits an application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for a Section 404(g) State Lead Grant.
