## RESOLUTION 9-7-76-E

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin wishes to become a Member Tribe of the National Congress of American Indians; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin meets all requirements for Tribal Membership pursuant to the Constitution of NCAI (Article II, Sec. I, b);

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee which is the official governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin, hereby authorizes Purcell Powless, Tribal Chairman, who is the principal official of the Tribe, to join the National Congress of American Indians; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that tribal funds in the amount of \$ \_\_\_\_\_, based on the Tribal Membership dues schedule of the NCAI BY-LAWS (Article III, Sec. 1,b), are authorized to be paid for such Tribal Membership in NCAI; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that based on membership of 6,653 persons, as verified by the records of Great Lakes Agency, the Tribe shall have \_\_\_\_\_ votes in accordance with the NCAI Constitution (Article IV, Sec. 3); and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article V, Sec. 2, of the NCAI Constitution, the Tribe designates Norbert Hill Sr., who is a member of NCAI in good standing, to be its official delegate to NCAI, and the Tribe designates Amelia Cornelius, also a member of NCAI in good standing, to be the alternate delegate to NCAI.
