RESOLUTION # 9-11-91-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Trust Committee is considered the official Committee designated by the Oneida General Tribal council to be responsible for all aspects of Oneida Tribal Enrollment, and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Trust Committee as the designated Committee to determine Oneida Tribal enrollment uses the "Membership Ordinance" passed by General Tribal Council on July 2, 1984, Resolution No. 6-2-84-A, and


WHEREAS, The Oneida Education and Training Department's Financial Aid - Higher Education Grant Office, processes all requests of unknown tribal enrollment through this Membership Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That the Oneida Education and Training Department's Financial Aid - Higher Education Division fully supports the Oneida Tribal Membership Ordinance and will continue to utilize this Ordinance in determining the criteria for Tribal Grant eligibility or higher education funding.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that only those who have at least 1/4 degree Oneida blood will be eligible to receive higher education Indian grants through the Tribe's Financial Aid - Higher Education Office in accordance with the Tribe's Membership Ordinance.
