Resolution 9-11-96-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is in the process of negotiating with the State of New York to settle the Oneida Land Claim; and
- WHEREAS, the Chief Negotiators have been the primary representatives of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin in settling the Oneida Land Claim; and
- WHEREAS, the Chief Negotiators representing the Oneida Nation have been the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, and the General Manager for the last fourteen (14) months; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council recognizes the necessity for continuity and timely progression of these negotiations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Treasurer, serve as Chief Negotiators, and the General Manager serve as an alternate, by representing the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED: that the Chief Negotiators bring back their final recommendations for settlement of the Oneida Land Claim to the Oneida Business Committee by January of 1998.

CERTIFICATION
