## RESOLUTION # 09-23-98-C

### CONTRACT FOR GRADING AND SURFACING OF STANDING STONE DRIVE

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Nation granted a right-of-way to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Standing Stone Drive located on the Oneida Reservation and authorized its chairperson and secretary to negotiate for the grading and surfacing of the same by bituminous of Resolution 7-01-98-B, and
- WHEREAS,** the Bureau of Indian Affairs, under Public Law 93-638, offered to the Oneida Nation contract No. CTF55T43339 for \$41,603.00 for the purpose of Standing Stone Drive Grading and bituminous surfacing.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** that the Oneida Nation authorizes its chairperson and its secretary to sign Contract CTF55T43339 and related documents, including a right-of-way to accomplish the grading of Standing Stone Drive.
