RESOLUTION #__9-29-99-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin the Oneida Tribe has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

EREAS the Oneida Tribe has assumed the responsibility for preserving and protecting the ecology and environment of the Oneida Reservation for future generations, and

TEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Conservation Department to "enhance, preserve, and protect our Nation's wildlife and natural resources while enforcing the hunting and fishing regulations", and

WHEREAS the Forest Management Deductions (FMD-10%) has funds available for new USDA/NRCS Conservation Reserve Program contracts for the year 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a Forest Management Budg and Use Plan to the Bureau of Indian Affairs/Ashland Agency to fund a project for planting trees on 200 acres of Oneida agricult all lands.
