RESOLUTION 10-20-93-E

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, to manage all the economic affairs and enterprises of the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Clinton B. Harrison Property

DESCRIPTION PARCELS A AND B COMBINED

A parcel of land being all of Government Lots 25 and 26, Section 17, and part of Government Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, Section 20, all in T24N, R19E, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, which is more fully described as follows:

Beginning at the W 1/4 corner of said Section 20; thence N00° 07'12"W, 2674.50 feet along the West line of the NW 1/4 of said Section 20 to the NW corner of said Section 20; thence N00° 06'53"W, 2639.56 feet along the West line of the SW 1/4 of said Section 17 to the West 1/4 corner of said Section 17; thence S89° 30'49"E, 993.02 feet along the North line of said Government Lot 25 to the NE corner of said Government Lot 25; thence S00° 02'30"E, 1315.76 feet along the East line of said Government Lot 25 to the SE corner of said Government Lot 25; thence N89° 44'43"W, 495.66 feet along the South line of said Government Lot 25 to the NE corner of said Government Lot 26; thence S00° 04'41"E, 1317.77 feet along the East line of said Government Lot 26 to the SE corner of said Government Lot 26; thence S89° 58'40"E, 164.94 feet along the North line of said Government Lot 7; thence S00° 08' 22"E, 1030.95 feet; thence N89° 45'32"W, 284.66 feet; thence S00° 08'22"E, 1646.08 feet to a point on the South line of the NW 1/4 of said Section 20; thence N89° 45'32"W, 376.00 feet along said South line to the POINT OF BEGINNING.

Said parcel contains 74.80 acres of land more or less (74.45 less road) and is subject to all easements and restrictions of record reserving that part presently being used for road purposes.

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to Trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in Trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
