WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin wishes to continue administering

the Tribal School and its ancillary programs, i.e. Chapter I and

Special Education, P.L. 142.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

That the Tribal Chairman is authorized to sign the necessary contracting documents for FY 1983/1984 School Year.
