RESOLUTION NO. 72-11-1

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is in the process of acquiring the allotment of Levi and Lewis Doxtator described as follows:

"Government Lot 3, (except the south 256.98 feet) Section 6, T.23N., R. 20E., Brown County, Wisconsin." and

"Government Lot 5, (except the south 0.94 acre) Section 6, T. 23N., R. 20E., containing 25.06 ± acres, Brown County, Wisconsin."

for the purpose of development for economic upgrading of the Oneidas,

WHEREAS, in order to acquire and develop same, funding is required from F.H.A. for land acquisition and to develop this property,

WHEREAS, services of I.T.A.C. are needed to formulate this program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the B.I.A. is requested to contact I.T.A.C. for any services they can render the Oneida Tribe, at the earliest possible date.
