## RESOLUTION 11-5-79A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc., has contracted an Indian Action Program since July, 1975, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Action Program has provided most of the technology and labor for the commercial building for the Oneida Tribe since July, 1975, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Action Program with the Oneida Tribal Development Corporation is providing the Oneida Tribe with a greater degree of independence and self determination, and
- WHEREAS, there appears to be a consistent and continuous effort in the national government to downgrade and diminish the Indian Action Programs, and
- WHEREAS, as as area Director, Mr. John Artichoker has consistently been in the forefront in the opposition to the Indian Action Team concept, and
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe believes the plan to move the Indian Technical Assistance Center to Brigham City, Utah and place it under the supervision of Mr. Artichoker is an obvious and flagrant effort to downgrade and diminish the Indian Action Program.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe opposes the plan to move the Indian Technical Assistance Center to Brigham City, Utah,
- AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we regard any attempt to associate Mr. Artichoker with the Indian Action Program as an act which will diminish or damage the Indian Action Program.
