WHEREAS, Mrs. Margaret Smith Summers resides on and has life use of a tract of tribal owned land located in Section 19, T.24N., R.20E., Brown County, Wisconsin, containing 58 acres more or less, and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Summers is agreeable to exchange her life interest in the tribal owned land to the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin for a trust deed or title to two acres of land surrounding her present home site, and

WHEREAS, the Peoples Marine Bank of Green Bay, Wisconsin, legal guardian of Mrs. Margaret Smith Summers is agreeable to the proposed land exchange.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Committee in regular session assembled is hereby authorized to deed two acres of Tribal owned land surrounding Mrs. Margaret Smith Summers home site to Mrs. Summers in exchange for her life interest in the tract of Tribal owned land.
