RESOLUTION 11-7-75-2

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribal Development Corporation has been delegated the force account task of constructing the Oneida Post Office, Youth Training Center and the Arts and Crafts Shop. Hereinafter known as the Oneida Post Office Complex.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Development Corporation has made an arrangement with the American Indian National Bank to carry the E.D.A. account for the Oneida Post Office Complex construction.


WHEREAS, the American Indian National Bank is receptive to making an advance construction loan with the Oneida Tribal Development Corporation, until E.D.A. funds are available.

WHEREAS, the loan from the American Indian National Bank will be in the amount of \$30,000. for paying the current expenses for the construction of the Oneida Post Office Complex.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribal Business Committee does hereby assign the necessary E.D.A. funds, guaranteeing repayment of the \$30,000. advance construction loan made to the Oneida Tribal Development Corporation plus the interest.
