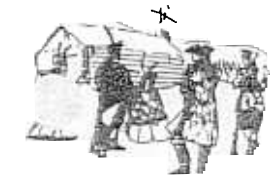

Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.


## RESOLUTION # 11-27-96-E

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the mission of the Oneida Police Department is to preserve and protect life through law enforcement and enhance the safety, welfare and peace of the Oneida reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe encourages collaborative efforts between the Oneida Police Department and the Outagamie Sheriff Department as well as other law enforcement agencies, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Police Department and the Outagamie Sheriff Department are in agreement to use the monies from their County-Tribal Law Enforcement grant to hire an enrolled Oneida into the Outagamie Sheriff Department to increase public awareness of the Tribe's presence in Outagamie County.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits application to the Department of Justice for a County-Tribal Law Enforcement grant from the Madison Department of Justice.

## CERTIFICATION
