Resolution # BC- 11-29-00-T

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Tribal Constitution, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has served notice of its intent to implement its Slot Accounting Remote Monitoring System ("SARMS") in all Wisconsin Tribal gaming facilities; and

WHEREAS, the SARMS project is a significant expansion of the slot accounting reporting requirements contained in the existing compacts between the State of Wisconsin and Wisconsin's Indian Nations; and

WHEREAS, the SARMS project embodies the potential for unrestricted access to confidential slot accounting information maintained by Tribal gaming facilities and the disclosure of statewide aggregate totals; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's Indian Nations have not received sufficient assurance from the State of Wisconsin that this information will be utilized in a manner consistent with existing gaming compacts.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin opposes the implementation of the SARMS project in any Wisconsin Tribal gaming facility.
